DEAR FRIENDS,


I'm so thrilled to share with you a brand new season of fantastic concerts at the Missoula Symphony - our 70th anniversary season!

The Missoula Symphony Chorale is anticipating an exciting and challenging season for 2024-2025! We look forward to joining the orchestra in December when we'll perform together in the annual Holiday Pops Concerts. These festive concerts have become the official kickoff to the holiday season in Missoula and as always, we'll offer our audiences a program of contrasting holiday favorites with a few surprises along the way.

In April, the Chorale will join the orchestra again for the final masterwork concert of the season in a performance of the epic Verdi Requiem. This large work is composed for four soloists, double choir, and orchestra.

Verdi composed it in memory of Alessandro Manzoni, an Italian writer and humanist who Verdi strongly admired. The question that arises for this piece might be, is it an opera or a funeral mass? Due to its operatic character, it is not performed in the church, but rather in the concert hall.

According to musicologist, David Rosen, this requiem is "probably the most frequently performed major choral work composed since the compilation of Mozart's Requiem." You won't want to miss this concert!!

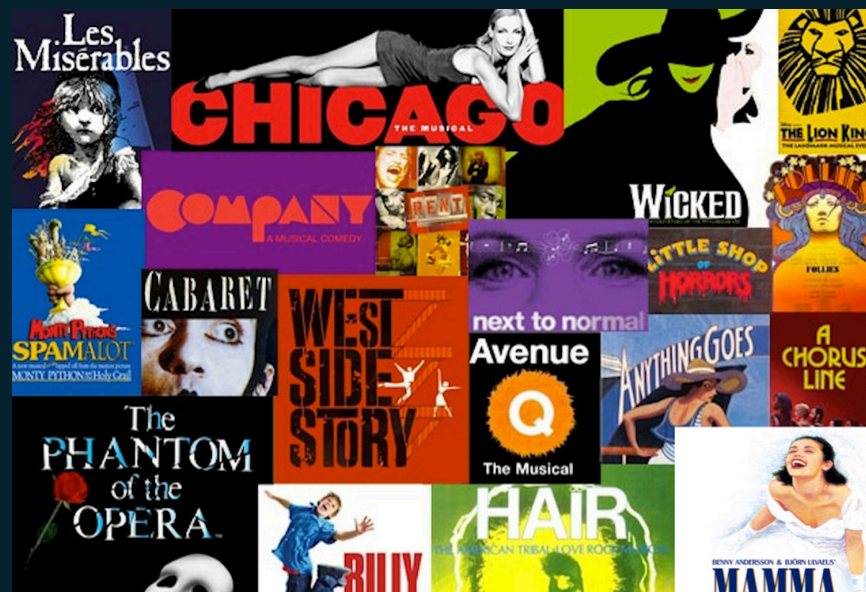

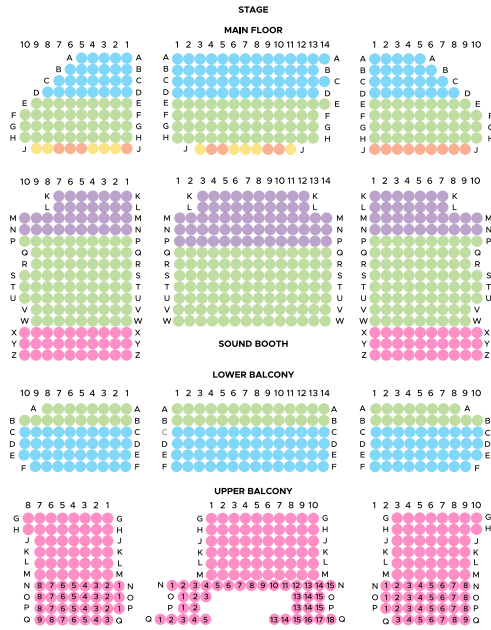

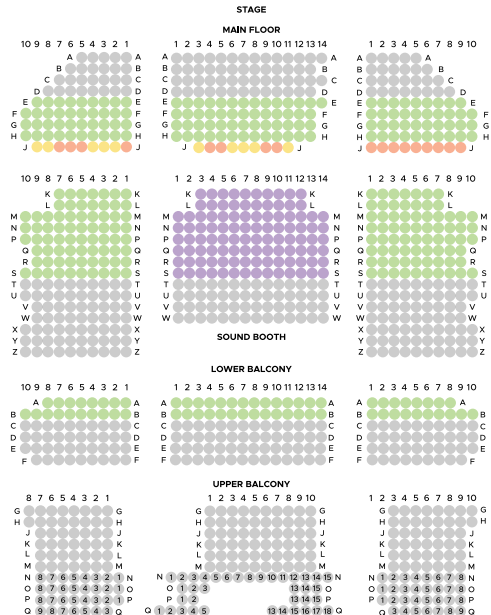


Theatre Map
